FUNDING FOR STUDENTS AND RECENT GRADUATES

1) Students:

Interdisciplinary Conference Funding for MSU Students, ESPP

Competitive funding for graduate students to present at interdisciplinary environmental conferences. Up to \$500.

February 13, May 8, August 14, November 13 (annual)

Campus Ecology Fellowship, National Wildlife Federation

For undergraduate and graduate students working with other members of the faculty, staff or administration on projects designed to help reverse global warming on campus and beyond. Up to \$2,000 for undergraduates; up to \$5,000 for graduate students. 10-15 awards annually.

October 1 (annual)

Grants and fellowships, American-Scandinavian Foundation.

For research or study in Scandinavia. Must have completed undergraduate education. Grants are \$5,000 for 1-3 months; fellowships are \$23,000 for one year. 30 awards annually.

November 1 (annual)

US-Egypt Joint Science and Technology Fund

Grants for visits up to 6 months by doctoral students. Up to \$15,000.

2) Recent graduates:

DISCCRS V: Interdisciplinary Climate Change Research Symposium, National Science Foundation

DISCCRS brings together natural and social scientists engaged in research related to climate change for a workshop; the goal is to establish a collegial peer network. Participants will present research, hone interdisciplinary communication skills, and discuss emerging issues with each other and mentors.

Workshop is March 13-20, 2010, in Arizona. Must have completed PhD between April 1, 2007 and July 31, 2009. 34 scholars chosen.

Post-doctoral Fellowships, University of Minnesota

Minnesota's Institute on the Environment has four positions open for Global Renewable Energy Leadership Fellows and four for NorthStar Fellows (who work with stakeholders on projects).

September 1, 2009

Postdoctoral Fellowships (Michigan Society of Fellows), University of Michigan

Must have completed PhD between June 1, 2007 and September 1, 2010. Three years of support.

\$51,000/year. Four awarded annually.

Foreign Travel

Developing Global Scientists and Engineers: International Research Experiences for Students, NSF
Proposals to support groups of U.S. undergraduate or graduate students conducting research abroad in collaboration with foreign investigators.

September 15, February 15 (annual). May be earlier MSU deadline

International Research and Education: Planning Visits and Workshops, NSF

Support the early phases of planning a research and education activity with foreign partners.

September 20, February 20, May 20 (or any time for planning visits) (annual)

Israel - United States Binational Agricultural Research and Development Fund

September 8 (annual)

Grants and fellowships, American-Scandinavian Foundation.

For research or study in Scandinavia. For graduate students and faculty. Grants are \$5,000 for 1-3 months; fellowships are \$23,000 for one year. 30 awarded annually.

November 1 (annual)

US-Egypt Joint Science and Technology Fund

Grants for joint research and workshops and for workshops, and for short-term visits by doctoral students.

October 20 (annual)

Other

Franklin Research Grants – American Philosophical Society

Small grants to support research leading to publication in all areas of knowledge. Aimed at early-career faculty. Up to \$6,000. 50 grants awarded annually.

October 1 and December 1 (annual)

Outstanding New Environmental Scientist Award (ONES) (R01), National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences

For early career researchers of the impact of environmental exposures on human health.

Letter of intent (optional) due October 5; application due November 3, 2009

Research and Evaluation on Education in Science and Engineering, NSF

November 12, 2009

Organization of Projects on Environmental Research in the Arctic, NSF

For activities to foster and sustain collaboration among projects funded by NSF that contribute to the US arctic environmental change research effort

October 11, 2009

Centers for Chemical Innovation, NSF

Supports research centers focused on major, long-term fundamental chemical research challenges.
