Dr. Maria Lapinski, MSU

Dr. Lapinski is joint-appointed as a Professor in the Department of Communication and Michigan Ag-Bio Research at Michigan State University (MSU). She served as the Associate Dean for Research for the College of Communication Arts and Sciences. Her research examines the impact of messages and social-psychological factors on health and environmental risk behaviors with a focus on culturally-based differences and similarities.

Dr. Ellis Adams, Georgia State University

Dr. Adams is Assistant Professor of Global Studies and Geosciences at the Global Studies Institute at GSA. His research lies at the intersection of human-environment interactions in cities, poor urban and peri-urban, and informal settlements of Sub-Saharan Africa.

Mr. Curtis' research focuses on helping communities develop and better understand water resource sustainability at a time when water resources are threatened and under growing duress locally, nationally and abroad.
