Workshop: Quarterly Estimated Tax for Fellowship Recipients

COGS has agreed to test out a new workshop for students for students to learn how to manage quarterly taxes. If you are not having federal income tax withheld from your paychecks, which is typical for fellowship and training grant stipends/salaries, you may be responsible for making manual tax payments to the IRS up to four times a year. Filling out the Estimated Tax Worksheet in IRS Form 1040-ES will tell you whether payments are required and in what amount. This workshop helps students navigate the tricky world of fellowships taxes. This particular workshop is applicable to US citizens only. *Cost of the program is \$20.
